Overdevelopment Forum Drew Crowd on June 14

Interested residents from Manhattan's East Side attended the Overdevelopment Forum where elected representatives and civic groups were on hand to cover a range of issues. Among the topics were the closing of loopholes in zoning regulations and various initiatives underway by elected representatives and communities.

Primary event sponsors were Manhattan Borough President Gale Brewer, N.Y. State Senator Liz Krueger and City Council Member Ben Kallos. Co-sponsors included Rep. Carolyn Maloney, State Senator José Serrano, State Assembly Members Rebecca Seawright and Dan Quart, City Council Member Keith Powers, Community Voices Heard, Historic Districts Council and Carnegie Hill Neighbors. Other participants included Friends of the East Side Historic Districts, CIVITAS, Community Board 8, The Municipal Arts Society and East River 50s Alliance, who are committed to to educate residents about the ongoing efforts in to stop overdevelopment in our community.



Turtle Bay Music School Building Sold

The TBMS sold its building at 244-246 East 52nd Street to Minrav Development on May 31, for an estimated \$11 million. The buyer is Minrav, the Israeli global development firm, which also has developments in Yorkville and Kips Bay.

Residents of the neighborhood are wondering what will happen to the Civil War-era building on 52nd Street. Minrav USA refused to comment on the purchase.

Find and Apply for Affordable Housing

A lottery for newly constructed affordable units at 222 East 44th Street is now open. The deadline to apply is July 2. To be eligible, applicants must have incomes between \$22,903 and \$135,590 depending on unit and family size. Asset limits also apply. Preference will be given to residents within the Community Board 6 district area [see map] for 50% of units, to mobility-impaired persons for 5% of units and visual- and/or

hearing-impaired persons for 2% of units.
