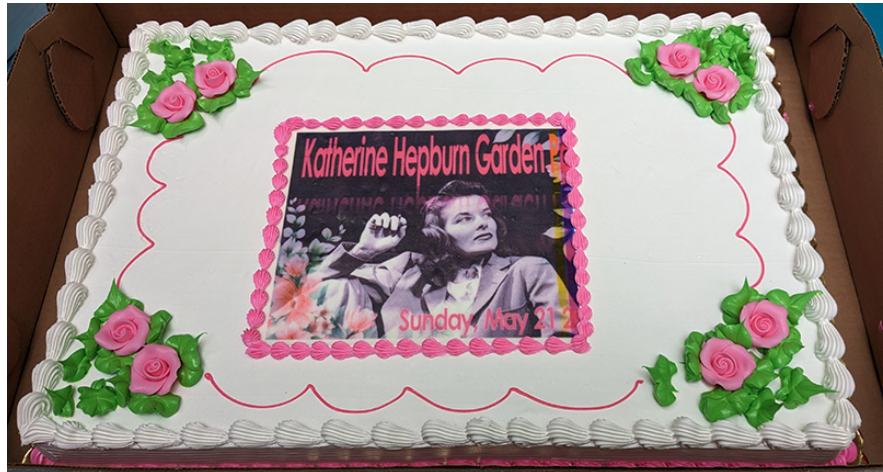

Congratulations to Captain Maggie Clamp who was appointed as the new Commanding Officer of the 17th Precinct at the end of April.

The much-decorated Captain Clamp previously served in Brooklyn's 71st Precinct as the Executive Officer, which is the second highest ranking post in the Precinct command. In her 17-year career with the New York Police

Department, including posts at the 76th Precinct in Brooklyn as well as the 6th Precinct in Greenwich Village, she has received 15 NYPD awards. Captain Clamp replaces 20-year NYPD veteran Deputy Inspector (DI) Aaron Edwards, who moved across town to take over the Midtown South Precinct which covers portions of Chelsea, Hell's Kitchen, and Times Square.
